Different kinds of music sound different. They have unique characteristics of style, patterns, origin, instruments and purpose.

A music genre is a category that groups music based on shared characteristics, sounds, or patterns.

Can you name some genres of music that you have heard? What is unique about them?

We can generally categorise music into four major categories:

- 1. Folk music *Lok sangeet*
- 2. Classical music Hindustani and Carnatic
- 3. Other traditional forms Devotional music, *Rabindra Sangeet*, semi-classical, etc.
- 4. Popular or creative music— Film songs, pop songs, etc.
